Crossroads Club	Pack the Haunted Box!	We will host a game called "pack the haunted box" that gives participants the opportunity to try and pack as many objects as they can, into the designated boxes under a 30 seconds time restriction. This is a game that is not only interactive and fun, but also incorporates some aspects of our club into the activity since when we volunteer at the Crossroads Charity, one of the main activities that we do is to pack things into boxes to get shipped out as aid internationally and globally.	We want to have these funds to donate to the Crossroads Charity to help them buy more boxes for their shipments of goods.
Nesbitt Centre	Arts and Crafts	We would provide art materials to participants so that they can create Halloween-themed crafts. Also, we would work with Craftable, which is related to our NGO, to sell products made by disabled adults to raise awareness about disability in our city.	The purpose of our fundraising will be to shed light on the Nesbitt Centre and what it is doing for the disabled community. All of the funds generated from the arts and crafts activity, as well as from selling Craftable's products, would be returned to the Nesbitt Centre.
UNICEF	Pie Throwing	Participants would have the opportunity to throw pies at their friends, family members, or even the leaders in exchange for their Pumpkin Festival tickets. This activity has been highly successful and engaging in the past, so we want to set up a pie-throwing booth again this year.	The purpose of our fundraising is to generate money for UNICEF. Being linked to the larger UNICEF organization, it is important that we redirect the money we raise to UNICEF so that they can put it towards helping children around the world. All of the money would be donated to UNICEF.
Migrant Power Club	Make a Bouquet	Create a bouquet for your helper using artificial flowers.	The main purpose of our fundraising will be to raise money to support the Gratitude and Giving Festival that is to occur in November. The Gratitude and Giving Festival is a club-run event held at the HKIS high school campus and invites domestic workers to join together in a dinner and various activities alongside members of the HKIS student body in order to further integrate them within our school community. The funds will be put towards purchasing enough food for everyone attending the event and purchasing the materials necessary to hold activities.
Mother's Choice	Mother's Choice Sand Bottles	Our planned idea is to do sand bottle making. We will purchase small jars as well as necklace charms which can be filled up with different colors of sand to create a nice decoration. This is the same as the booth that Mother's Choice ran last year. We will create a poster with the different colors and what Mother's Choice value they represent so while they make the sand bottle, we can tell them about Mother's Choice. We will also include small tags/notes on the bottles with the Mother's Choice mission and contact information to spread awareness, as well as handing out brochures about Mothers' Choice.	The purpose of our fundraising is so we can raise money to buy books and toys to donate to the Mother's Choice children for Christmas. We're planning on wrapping gifts and dressing up as elves to make their Christmas experience just a little bit more cheerful.
Kids N Hoops	Mini Basketball Hoop Activity	We will have 2 mini basketball hoop machines. We will have a set of prizes for HKIS students at the festival. Each time someone wants a try at the basketball game, they will have to give in their pumpkin festival tickets.	All the money from the pumpkin festival tickets will go to underprivileged children all over Hong Kong. This money will be used to buy various basketball accessories such as basketball shoes, basketballs etc. This charity drive will strengthen the communities of these underprivileged children as they will receive donations which will improve their standards of living.

ASAP	Dog toys	A station to make braided dog toys out of old rags and clothes as well as sell dog toys we have already made.	Funds will be donated to SKSF a dog shelter that we have worked with very closely for the past few years.
Sports4Change	Spooky Soccer Shootout	<p>Our activity is a penalty shootout where the volunteers take penalties at a blocked small goal (i. e., only certain parts of the goal are exposed) to make as many as possible with three shots. Here is a quick rundown of the activity we're envisioning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - There will be different lines on the floor with varying distances depending on the grade and skill level, as chosen by the player. - They will then take three shots at a target, aiming to make all three. - There will be no goalie; however, the goal will be blocked at specific points with a cover, only exposing small goal-scoring regions. - Afterward, the player can head to our setup desk to claim their candy prize and learn more about what we do as a UN-certified NGO. We will use the funds we raise from this event to run our upcoming events with Sunshine Action, a registered HK charity aiming to support the impoverished, to fund different support programs that teach sports to the disadvantaged on a bi-weekly basis, and raise money for our charity partner; Sunshine Action. These funds will go to their Fortune Bag program which helps to provide daily necessities to those who need them most in the form of gift bags. Additionally, this fundraiser allows our newer members to earn volunteering experience while helping raise funds for our organization. This opportunity will help us host larger fundraisers in the future as we will have a more experienced team alongside us.
Children's Reading Club	Juggling balloon game	Have someone juggle multiple balloons each representing a different aspect of living as a refugee (e.g. food, education, language, accommodation, freedom). Then they have to do whatever they can to keep balloons from leaving the marked area (maybe 3x3 meters?) or touching the ground. If a balloon touches the ground then you mark it off on a game card. After the thirty seconds, you give a debrief on how the contestant did and what they ended up with and give a verbal summary.	Some upcoming initiatives is the Christmas party and gratitude and giving where I would need club funds for. Another use is a donation of money and also some products that our NGO, Branches of Hope, needs.
Green Dragons	Fishing for Waste	A fun interactive game where people will answer an environmental trivia question and then are allocated a certain amount of time to fish for as many plastic bottles in a pool of water (kiddie pool) based on how many questions they answer correctly. Inside of the bottles, we will put fun facts of how waste impacts the environment, focused on waste in water. The fishing rods are magnetic and the plastic bottles have magnets on the cap, for easy fishing. Based on how much trash is collected in that amount of time a corresponding prize will be rewarded such as candy. Kids are able to become more aware in terms of waste in water, while also playing a fun game!	As an action oriented club, we hold many environmental service opportunities for our members to take part in. For example, in the past we have held beach cleanups, hikes, trips to NGO facilities, all of which require funding to acquire materials of (beach cleanup requires gloves, bags, food, transportation etc). We would be using the funding to help our club continue preform service activities throughout the year, to support and enhance each of our members' learning experience .
For Girls	Period Toss	<p>Our station has two parts.</p> <p>First, we'd like to host our game 'Period Toss'. The idea is there are several glasses full of water, one filled with the average amount of blood lost during a period. There will be buckets each labelled with a cup number. Participants will guess which cup is the cup with the correct amount of water by throwing bean bags at the buckets. Should they guess correctly and get their bean bag into the bucket they win a small prize.</p> <p>Secondly, we hope to sell our club's peppers (approximately 40-60 depending on the type). These are peppers that we get from our collaboration with farms in Cambodia.</p>	The funds we gain from selling these peppers go to our partner NGO 'Plan International' which uses the funds to support people in period poverty in Cambodia. The peppers come from Cambodia, and the funds we raise go back to Cambodia. Additionally, the funds we gain from the game will also go to Plan International and our work in Cambodia.
